From the Keyboard of Pastor Kate



Beloved Siblings in Christ -

Grace and peace be with you all! We are Easter people, and this Easter season (April 4 – May 23) is especially spectacular as we experience increasing light and life emerging from the winter's slumber. As I talk with people, I am hearing even deeper appreciation and gratitude for spring as we are also emerging from the isolation of the pandemic as well. Human beings were not designed to live in isolation. We have been created in the image of God, and one of those ways is that we were made to be in mutually loving relationships – relationship

with God, and relationship with others. We do not truly live (certainly not the abundant life for which Jesus came to bring)—without them. We are being reminded of our needs and God's provision as we step out, literally and figuratively, into life being awakened and renewed all around us!

Just as we've been experiencing it individually and in the Darlington community (or wherever this letter may find you), we are experiencing it as Grace Lutheran Church as well! You need to hear my deep appreciation to all of you who so faithfully met together during our six weeks of Lenten mid-week worship, and our worship during Holy Week on Palm Sunday, Maundy Thursday, and Good Friday. Thank you to those of you who joined together to help the home-bound know that they continue to be a beloved part of us and remembered, through phone calls, cards, Lent-in-abag, decorations, treats, and opportunities to worship at a distance. Thank you, leadership of Grace, for continuing to meet together (on Zoom and in person), for looking out for and supporting the work of this congregation, for Council spending four hours on a Saturday in March to take inventory and move toward envisioning God's call for our congregation with curiosity and imagination as we walk together as disciples of Christ for the sake of our neighbors.

We are church together! <u>Of most importance is your continued presence at worship each</u> <u>week.</u> This is our vital link of connection to one another. If on-line worship is how you need to be present in worship, we ask that you stay in touch with the Council, and other ministry leaders, encouraging them with your continued support through prayer, involvement, and ideas for the ministry of Grace Lutheran Church. At worship we continue to wear masks, sit in family groups with 6 ft. between, enjoy music while singing softly or humming, and receive communion with modifications, trusting that our attention to safer practices allows us to come together with loving consideration for each other and those beyond us who depend upon our health for theirs.

The prayer below is one of the most honest descriptions of our faith life together – Grace Lutheran Church in Darlington, Wisconsin. We are one in the body of Christ, and though we are not able to see where God is leading us, we know whose we are and the One who leads us and walks with us, taking us by the hand and promising: "I will never leave you or forsake you."

"Lord, you call your servant to ventures of which we cannot see the ending, by paths untrodden and through perils unknown. Give us faith to go out with good courage, not knowing where we go, but only that your hand is leading us and your love supporting us, through Jesus Christ, our Lord. Amen."


