# Where do you go to find truth?

Where do you seek trustworthy guidance for everyday life -- to get the "big picture" perspective?

One thing we can say about today's world: there is no lack of information. We're inundated with it ... completely overwhelmed by it at every turn! So many sources: Email, Facebook, snail mail, junk mail, tv, internet sites, news apps, books, magazines, podcasts, radio, talk shows, advertising, political campaign literature, school papers, work papers, newspapers, newsletters, paperwork (whether actual paper or on-line forms), and of course, whatever the people we're around are passing out by word-of-mouth.

Yet "information" is not necessarily "truth." Often times we want to believe it is, either because it's easier, or because it matches up with our personal views and the views of our "tribe" – those people with whom we're the closest, who we count on to have our backs.

There has only been one pure source of truth in the world. The gospels tell us that *one source* is the **word of God**. It was through the word of God that all things created - seen and unseen - came into being. The word of God came to humanity by the Spirit, first as spoken word, then written, and then in the person of Jesus Christ, only Son of God -- to show us the way through this life and into the next. It is the One who designed and created all things who is the only one who has the trust, the **whole** picture.

God's Word was, is, and always will be *life*. God's word not only *brings* life into being, it sustains and renews life. That is true of the person, Jesus Christ, and that is true of God's word that is written, preached, and proclaimed.

As Christians we proclaim in faith that this is true, and yet where do we actually go in search of truth that promises life? More often than not, its not to God or to God's word, but everywhere else. There's a song by Casting Crowns called, *What If His People Prayed*, that reflects names our tendency:

What if the life that we pursue Came from a hunger for the truth? What if the family turned to Jesus Stopped asking Oprah what to do?

What if we, God's children, first turned to our God, to the Word, and to prayer to find and follow the truth? What if? God promises to hear and to answer those who seek God with all their heart. I pray that we will each seek out and commit to opportunities with one another for hearing, studying, and growing in Truth.

Please take a look at what is available. You will not find a better source than Truth itself.

Grace's next turn will be in January. Contact Marilyn Johns (608/482-1771) if interested for January.


