From the Keyboard of Pastor Kate



There is so much that is capable of causing worry, anxiety, even fear in our daily lives. Situations regarding mental and physical health, situations surrounding loved ones and neighbors, our ability to make a living, to cope and balance all that's coming at us from every direction (add a pandemic onto that!), increasing outside expectations of us, the worry that we're not enough, that we'll fail, or that we might be "found out" for who we *really* are, situations where we feel lonely, isolated, insignificant, unseen. Not to mention all the societal issues! Try as we might, we cannot escape the endless possibilities available to us when it comes to worry.

And yet we hear throughout scripture that it is not God's will that we spend so much energy worrying. Jesus, speaking the words of the Father, tells us:

"Who of you by being anxious can add a single hour to their life? ... So do not worry, saying, "What shall we eat?" or "What shall we wear?" For the pagans run after all these things, and your heavenly Father knows that you need them. But seek first his kingdom and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well. Therefore, do not worry about tomorrow, for tomorrow will worry about itself. Each day has enough trouble of its own."

- Matthew 6:27, 31-34

I don't believe Jesus is saying "don't be concerned." After all, he says, "Each day has enough trouble of its own." Jesus knows. Our God knows. Jesus came to us as "Immanuel"—God with Us, fully God and fully human. Jesus also taught us that to know him is to know the Father, and what Jesus shared with his disciples were the words he received from the Father.

I'm a worrier about some things. I don't want to be, but I am. I'm concerned, but it goes beyond that. Sometimes my mind fixates on a worry. Over and over it loops back through it, trying to see some light, come up with a solution, fix the problem. When I'm in the loop, those worries take up a lot of my time, energy, and creative abilities. They rob me of the peace that is gifted to me in Christ through the Spirit. It isn't long before I get distracted, discouraged; my hope wanes. I feel heavy-burdened, tired, and maybe even depressed. Then I might imagine myself as the infamous Martha, a dear friend of Jesus, who welcomed him and the disciples into her home when he was in Bethany.

On one of these occasions, Mary her sister spent her time sitting at Jesus' feet, listening to all that he was saying, while Martha was distracted by all the preparations that had to be made. Frustrated, she pointedly asks Jesus, "Don't you care that my sister has left me to do the work by myself? Tell her to help me!"

Jesus' reply to Martha? Jesus looks into her face, into her soul, and says, "Martha, Martha," (I imagine Jesus saying my name, gazing at me with the same love, speaking to me with gentleness and compassion in his voice — with the grace of God, and not the "mean-girl" voice in my head.) "You are worried and upset about many things, but only one thing is needed. Mary has chosen what is better, and it will not be taken away from her."

"Only one thing is needed."

"Seek first his kingdom and his righteousnesss," and all that you truly need will be provided for you as well. Trust me. Spend time at my feet. Come to know me better. Remember once again that you are my Beloved, my little child, and I am with you and for you always and forever. Lay those burdens at my feet, and embrace my love for you instead."

Thank you, Jesus. You're always just what I need. Thank you for reminding me.
