Join in Worship with Grace

After thorough, prayerful, and thoughtful consideration and discussion, we have returned to indoor worship at Grace Lutheran Church beginning October 11, 2020.

Please remember there is *no* way to gather in person which *eliminates all risk* of transmitting COVID. There are only safer choices and modifications we can make to reduce the risk to ourselves, those around us, and the community at large. Our personal choices are an expression of care for self and neighbor; they are profoundly faithful decisions.

For the sake of the health and safety of our community, we will be adhering to the following guidelines:

- 1. If you are feeling ill, have a fever, have been exposed to someone with COVID-19 within the last fourteen days, or have a compromised immune system, please do not attend worship in person.
- 2. The CDC recommends that people over 65 and those with underlying conditions continue to stay safer at home. We trust you will use your best judgement and make healthy decisions based upon your own situation and level of comfort.
- 3. Face coverings are required to be worn over the nose and mouth in worship and when other people are in the building. If you forget to bring your own, disposable masks will be provided.
- 4. Please maintain proper social distancing (at least 6' apart) before, during, and following worship. Ushers will assist with seating by household to maintain safe distancing and 25% capacity, and will release participants by household following the service. If we reach capacity, additional persons will be ushered to the lower level for audio attendance.
- 5. Please keep hands clean and sanitized, including when entering and exiting the building and after coming in contact with common surfaces. Sanitizing stations are provided.
- 6. There will be no in-person choral or congregational singing. When music is provided, feel free to listen, whisper, hum, or move to the music.

- 7. At the present time Holy Communion will not be celebrated. This may change in the future if/when the Council approves a safer procedure.
- 8. An offering plate will be placed at the back of the Sanctuary for giving upon entrance and exit.
- 9. To accommodate contact tracing (should it become necessary) and lines of communication, attendance cards are located for your household in each available spot in the pews. Please complete with the date, names in your party, and updated contact information. Place your card and any used writing utensils provided in the basket provided next to the offering plate.
- 10. There will be no in-person fellowship with refreshments. If choosing to remain inside to connect with others, please keep connections short and maintain social distancing.
- 11. The Sanctuary and public spaces will be sanitized each week.
- 12.If you are not able or have made a faithful choice not to attend in-person worship at this time, you can access Sunday services in the following ways:
 - a. Live-stream on Facebook at Facebook.com/DarlingLutherans
 - b. YouTube https://www.youtube.com/channel/ UCT69499PsJBJbLq98exjQqQ (will be available within a day or two of the service and the link emailed)
 - c. Receive an email or mailing with the worship bulletin, a printed version of the sermon, and occasional devotional materials (contact the church office to request at 608.776.4462 or <u>GraceDar@centurytel.net</u>.
- 13. Due to our internet capabilities and need for ban width for the service, please refrain from using the church's wi-fi around the time and during the worship service.
- 14. Please make sure to update the office with your current contact information so that we can communicate changes and information as necessary.

These options are a low-tech experiment, along with the hope to make adjustments and learning as we go. Please feel free to contact me or any of our council members with any questions, concerns, or constructive feedback!

From the Desk of Pastor Kate

Beloved People of Grace,

When I think of all of you during these strange times, I am reminded of the apostle Paul and his letters to some of the churches he established among the Gentiles and how he longed to see them, be with them, worship with them, and teach them. This last weekend we heard the beginning of Paul's first letter to the Thessalonians. In it he writes on behalf of himself, Timothy, and Silas:

We always give thanks to God for all of you and mention you in our prayers, constantly remembering you before our God and Father your work of faith and labor of love and steadfastness in hope in our Lord Jesus Christ. For we know, [siblings] beloved by God, that he has chosen you... So deeply do we care for you that we are determined to share with you not only the gospel of God, but also our own selves, because you have become very dear to us. -- 1 Thessalonians 1:2-4, 2:8

How I long for the time when we can be all together in our physical bodies to worship, pray, fellowship, encourage, serve, learn, and commune! I want to meet you in person, get to know you, spend time with you, study scripture and pray with you, and be inspired by the Holy Spirit through you! I know many of you miss being together as well. Some of you have been unable to be physically present at church for much longer than this pandemic as you have fought battles around your health. We have had only a taste of the separation and isolation that you have suffered as someone who is home-bound. It is even harder now that you are limited even more by people being able to visit you.

The pandemic has limited our freedom in many ways, but it has also brought us surprising, beautiful opportunities. It has given us a way to empathize with our homebound members, neighbors, and others who may be struggling right now in isolation. Perhaps it has given us more time and hunger for prayer and connection. We may not be able to be physically present with one another, but I encourage us to use this time to reach out to those who are isolated. If you're one of them and you're able, reach out, too! Make a call. Send a card. Offer special prayers. Provide treats or something else to be enjoyed. Record a video that can be shared by a caregiver. Watch for opportunities organized by the congregational life team at Grace to connect. Both the recipient and you will be blessed!
